STAGE 1: Identifying Desired Results

Big Idea: Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations

- Students will construct at least three to five mixed media elements in an assemblage
- Students will apply copper foil to create a border around 1 inch by 1 inch glass squares
- Students will demonstrate the safe procedure of cutting glass with stain glass cutting tool
- Students will demonstrate cutting a small and rigid line using an x-acto knife
- Students will demonstrate using a stain glass cutting tool to score and break glass
- Students will apply the repetition of circles, squares, and rectangles in their assemblage project.
- Students will produce collage techniques in final assemblage project

- Etched Design and Compositional Study
 - Students' complete worksheet as directed in class.
 - The Compositional Study includes a detailed sketch of the interior of the shadow box, diagramming intended visual movement. It also includes answering the 3 questions.
 - The Etched Design should be done on tracing paper stapled to the Compositional Study.
- Nearly finished without glass discussion prompt in Schoology
 - Students when you are satisfied with the inside of your assemblage, please take a nice photograph looking directly down into the composition. Crop your view so that you are just seeing the edges of the box. We don't want to see the table anything laying around your project. Rotate your image if necessary.
- Artist statement and reflection

Stage 3: Sequence of Lessons

Day 1 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Small strips of glass, self-healing mats, glass cutters

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Power Point presentation 3D Assemblage
- Project Introduction

Supplies and Resources Needed: See, Think, Wonder handout, several found objects

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Show a video (4:50 mins) Assemblage by The Museum of Contemporary Art. (Betye Saar speaks on the video) https://youtu.be/alCiumy8tjE (need to edit out word)
- Choose one of the assemblage artworks by Betye Saar and then ask the students to complete (See, Think, Wonder handout) 1. What do you **see**? What do you **think** about that? What does it make you **wonde**r?
- Have several found objects at the center of each table, as a group, each table will have about 10 mins to create an assemblage together

Day 2 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Watercolors and brushes

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Show video (6:57 mins) Color Theory Basics: Use the Color Wheel & Color Harmonies to Choose Colors that Work Well Together https://youtu.be/Yel6Wgn4178.
- Discussion on color theory.
- Give out the study guide on color wheel relationships and then the students can choose either the abstract color scheme practice sheet or the landscape color schemes practice sheet
- Students are to choose color scheme for project and upload to Schoology discussion post

Day 3 Big Idea - Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Stations set up around the room with different painting, stenciling, etc.

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Show video (4:51 mins) Collage: A History on the Creative Technique of Combining and Modifying. https://youtu.be/-HB3IrP_jRO
- Collage Day 1 Explain to the students the various stations set up around the room
- On the back of the collages the students are to write 10 different themes (as possible ideas to explore in their project)
- Each table group will move to the various stations one table at a time (students have about 10-15 mins at each station

Day 4 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Stations set up around the room with different painting, stenciling, etc.

- Collage Day 2 Students continue to explore the various stations one table at a time (students have about 10-15 mins at each station)
- Remind the students about using their color scheme for their project

Day 5 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Precut matboard for large and small boxes, glue, x-acto knife, self-healing mats

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Power Point presentation 3D Assemblage
 Continue with presentation, speak about focal point and theme
- Students are to choose a section of the collage/mixed media paper to apply to the matboard (which will turned into the large box) (the paper will be applied to the inside of the box)
- Focal point and theme discussion prompt in Schoology
- Students are to create the large and small box
- Scoring, folding, and taping the edges of the boxes together

Day 6 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Precut matboard for large and small boxes, glue, x-acto knife, self-healing mats

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Studio workday. Students continue to create the boxes
- Students can apply tissue paper to the small boxes
- Demonstration on creating foam core elements
- Students can start to glue found objects and other mixed media provided in a variety of trays

Day 7 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Trays set up with found items and mixed media supplies, X-acto knifes, glue

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Studio workday, this is the last day the students can work on the foam core elements.
- Explain to the students about craftmanship when cutting around the images with the X-acto knifes.
- Emphasis the importance of having small edges and to remove any jagged edges.
- Students continue to glue found objects and other mixed media provided in a variety of trays

Day 8 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations

Supplies and Resources Needed: strips of glass that is pre-cut into 1 inch width, glass cutters, copper foil, the trays set up with variety of found items and mixed media supplies

- Define glass
- Demonstrate how to cut and score glass into squares to cover the foam element or
 if the student chooses to cover any smaller boxes within their assemblages.
- Demonstrate how to apply copper foil to the edges of the glass
- Students continue to glue found objects and other mixed media provided in a variety of trays

Day 9 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations

Supplies and Resources Needed: strips of glass that is pre-cut into 1 inch width, glass cutters, copper foil, the trays set up with variety of found items and mixed media supplies

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Power Point presentation 3D Assemblage (Composition and Construction)
 Continue with presentation, speak about the etched design
- Discuss with students about the idea of composition and the etched design which will be on the front of the glass.
- Allow the students some time to research on their computers about black and white design
- Digital Sketch uploaded to Schoology

Day 10 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Trays set up with variety of found items and mixed media supplies, and vinyl cut to fit the front of the glass

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Power Point presentation 3D Assemblage (Composition and Construction)
 Continue with presentation, show video demonstration of cutting out the design
- Studio workday to sketch ideas of designs that would complement their assemblage boxes or cut out the design to be etched on the front glass

Day 11 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Trays set up with variety of found items and mixed media supplies, and vinyl cut to fit the front of the glass, Armour Etch

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Power Point presentation 3D Assemblage
 Continue with presentation, show video demonstration of how to etch glass with Armour Etch
- Studio workday to cut out the design to be etched on the front glass, and allow students who are ready to work back at the sinks using the Armour Etch

Day 12 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations

Supplies and Resources Needed: Trays set up with variety of found items and mixed media supplies, and vinyl cut to fit the front of the glass, Armour Etch, E9000 glue

- Show video (2:42 mins) Betye Saar: Call and Response https://youtu.be/isxEBXu23J0
- Studio workday on assemblage project

Day 13 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Trays set up with variety of the found items and mixed media supplies, and vinyl cut to fit the front of the glass, Armour Etch, E9000 glue

Detail of lesson procedures:

- Studio workday to finish up the assemblage project
- Students finish adding their choice of elements from the various boxes of supplies of found objects and mixed media
- Nearly finished without glass discussion prompt in Schoology students must complete by end of class
- Demonstrate how to glue the glass to the matboard then students will glue the etched glass to their matboard

Day 14 Big Idea - Artists explore society, culture, and history through artistic investigations Supplies and Resources Needed: Pre-printed question cards and prize cards (placed in a basket), and a prize box (filled with art supplies and candy)

- Demonstration: Show students how to attach the matboard with glass front to their box using duct tape, and then show how to attach paperclip and string so the artwork will be able to be displayed.
- Students will be given a handout to be filled out on their artist statement for the assemblage project and a reflection.
